➤ iiNET Enhanced look

iiNET Online has upgraded its look and feel to be inline with IATA's new branding. Along with new branding we have also introduced other enhancements that are geared towards making your data exchange experience more efficient and user friendly.

For convenience purposes, iiNET Data Exchange and Information Gateway can now be accessed from the same login page. Based on your username, iiNET will identify the service group you belong to and log you into your account without having to go through multiple pages.

Once you are logged onto your account, you will notice that an announcement page has replaced the main page menu. This will help us inform you of the latest updates and upcoming releases and events. The main menu has been placed on the page header and appears in every webpage to make your browsing and use of the online interface more convenient.

In your account file tracking section you are now able to trace files for up to 1 year after the transaction is made. In the previous iiNET online version tracking was limited to 60 days only. With this new enhancement you can select a range of up to 365 days and iiNET will list all files that are available for immediate retrieval (submitted to your account in the last 60 days) and those that are stored in the archives (from up to 1 year from the submission). To request archive restoration service for files older than 60 days simply contact iiNET Care team.

All these and other enhancements are made possible by your ongoing support of iiNET Data Exchange Service and we truly thank all our clients for their continuing confidence!



➤ New File Renaming Feature

Since automation is becoming the new trend for iiNET data exchange, we strive to bring new solutions to our users and help limit manual intervention and allow for a higher degree of automation and integration of iiNET processes into existing data processing applications.

One of the challenges to automation was the names of BSP HOT and ARC CAT files, which lack common naming conventions and sometimes cause confusion and prevent seamless automated operation.

In order to cater to our clients' requests for naming standards and to allow carriers to choose the naming conventions most suitable for the use with their automated systems, the iiNET team has introduced a File Renaming enhancement. At the moment this enhancement is available for the most common file types – BSP HOT and ARC CAT, with plans to add other file types in the future.

Phase one of iiNET file renaming was rolled into production in the second quarter of 2006, and it is picking up steam among our automated and manual clients alike.

HOT and CAT files can be renamed to satisfy virtually any naming convention fit to an airline, with any combination of static and the following dynamic elements (identified from file header record):

- BSPI - 3-letter BSP city code (HOT)
- TACN - 3-digit Carrier Code (HOT/ CAT)
- CARR - 2-letter Carrier Code (HOT/ CAT)
- PRDA - Production Date (HOT)
- BAED - Billing Analysis End Date (HOT)
- ISOC - 2-letter ISO Country Code (HOT/ CAT)
- FN - Original File Name (inside ZIP archive) (HOT/ CAT)
- PCID – Area Identification (CAT)
- PPED – Production Period End Date (CAT)

➤ IDEC Becomes The Industry Standard For Electronic Tickets

The annual IATA Passenger Services Conference, which was held in Geneva in November last year, formally adopted into the electronic ticket resolutions the requirement that all carriers wishing to have interline electronic ticketing agreements in place must be a member of the Interline Data Exchange Centre (IDEC) in order to participate in the electronic billing of interline electronic tickets. Without IDEC participation, interline electronic ticketing will not be possible.

Whilst IDEC supports standard interline billing needs in an electronic format, the major problem seen by carriers interlining electronic tickets is that without IDEC the revenue accounting process is hindered by the fact that it generates paper type billing documents supporting electronic transactions. The Revenue Accounting Panel (RACP) strongly supports this move since it will streamline and automate another part of the process thereby adding further value to electronic ticketing.

iiNET will continue to support fast and secure data exchange of IDEC Passenger and Cargo data between the airlines and the Airline Tariff Publishing Company (ATPCO) and will remain the preferred data distribution method for the industry.

IATA will host the 40th Annual Revenue Accounting Meeting. RA40 is a scheduled 3-day meeting and is expected to attract 70/75 airlines and approximately 150 participants. The meeting is open to Airlines and IATA Strategic Partners. This meeting votes upon proposals to amend and incorporate new rules in the interline billing process through the Revenue Accounting Manual. As we move towards a paperless ticketing environment, it is expected that Revenue Accounting preparation for e-ticketing will be a major area for discussion.




