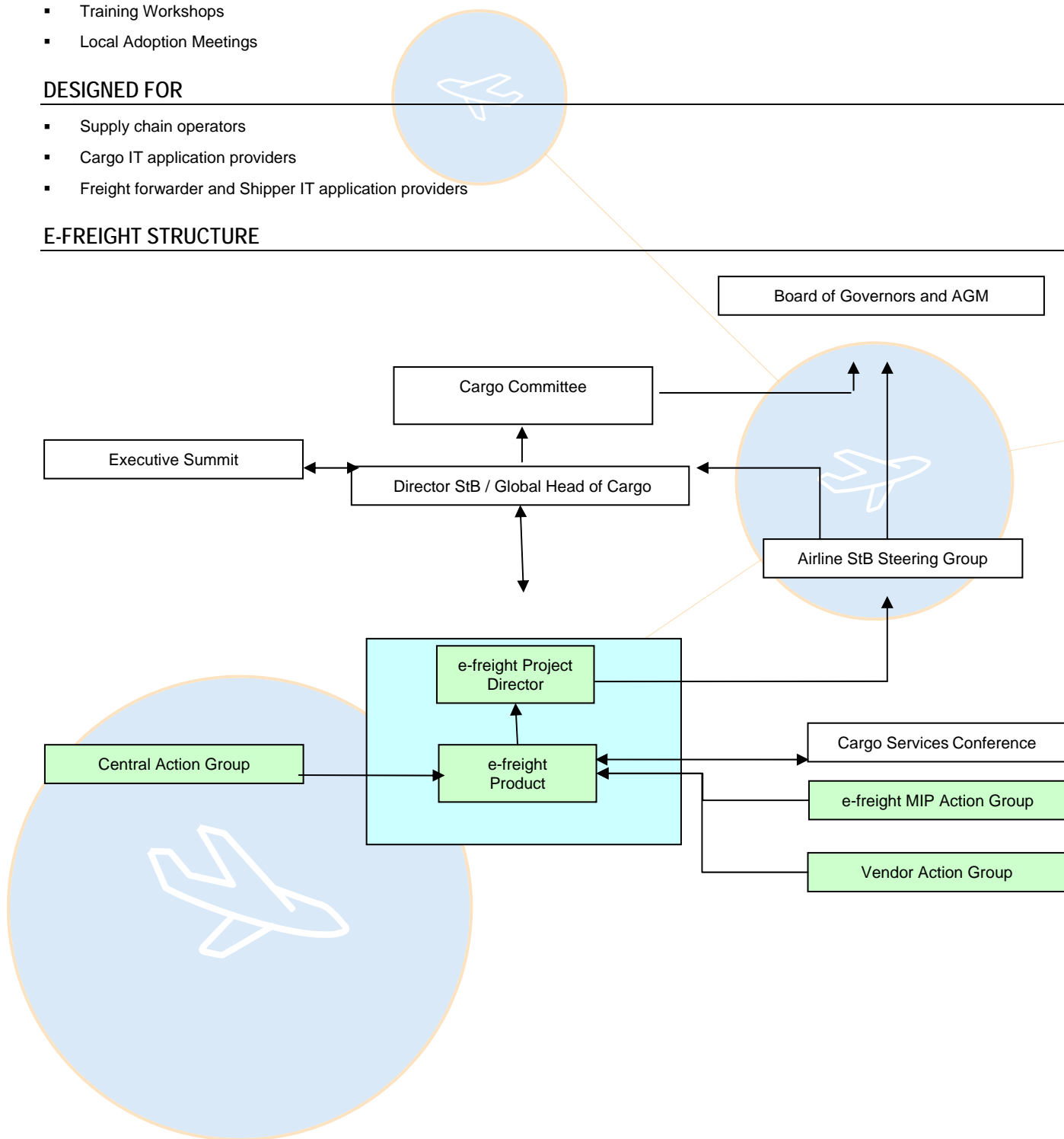

The IATA e-freight project aims to take the paper out of air cargo. Facilitated by IATA, the project is an industry-wide initiative involving carriers, freight forwarders, ground handlers, shippers and customs authorities. Twice a year, the e-freight Vendor Action Group meets face to face to discuss how best to continue supporting this initiative. Typically, the Strategic Partners involved in this are IT suppliers.

Key benefits from involvement include:

The objectives of the Cargo XML Task Force are to provide recommendations to the Cargo Business Processes Panel (CBPP) on XML requirements for transportation messages and on the maintenance of the standards as well as to oversee the technical development of these XML messages, which will be based as much as possible on existing messages (i.e. CIMP IFTMIN) and international standards (i.e. UN/CEFACT Core Components and XML Naming and Design Rules).
