Built on now outdated structures


Driven by historical processes

As time went by – from 1960s until now!




From isolated operations → to global interconnected exchange

A joint effort: industry, organizations, and governments




Embedded in modern processes and mobile systems

Transitioning to a modern, flexible format


Principle: Base the format on stakeholder needs

- Conflicting requirements must be openly discussed!For example:
- Governments want as much data as possible
- Airlines cannot always supply all requested data

Format vs Regulation

- Format defines structure (Header, IDs, DOB optional)
- Regulations define requirements (making optional fields mandatory in certain countries)

Result: One flexible format, adaptable to many jurisdictions



Scope for Governments - Using passenger data to identify suspects




Conclusion
