Latin America is currently experiencing a period of economic uncertainty and geopolitical tension. Various countries have changed governments bringing in some cases of unpredictability to the aviation sector. Although the Latin American market still rises above the industry's average, the existing regulatory landscape does not encourage economic and social development. This panel will analyze the pressing regulatory issues affecting the market and the changes the industry should introduce to stimulate growth and exploit its true potential.

It is no longer possible to ignore the crucial role and availability of electronic data as a new cornerstone and foundation of the air cargo supply chain. Shippers, consignees, carriers, security and customs authorities, forwarders, and ground handlers increasingly rely on and demand immediate access to information.

The integration of electronic systems and data into the air carriage algorithm lags considerably behind.
