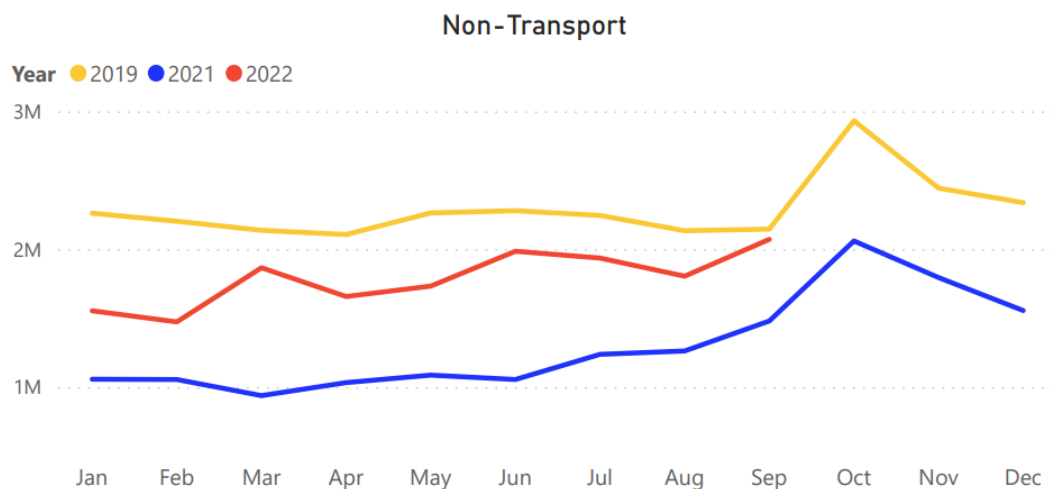

SIS Volumes Monthly Update

Dear SIS participants,

Welcome to the September update of the SIS Volumes Monthly Update. As summer travel concludes, we see continual slowdown in the SIS volumes.

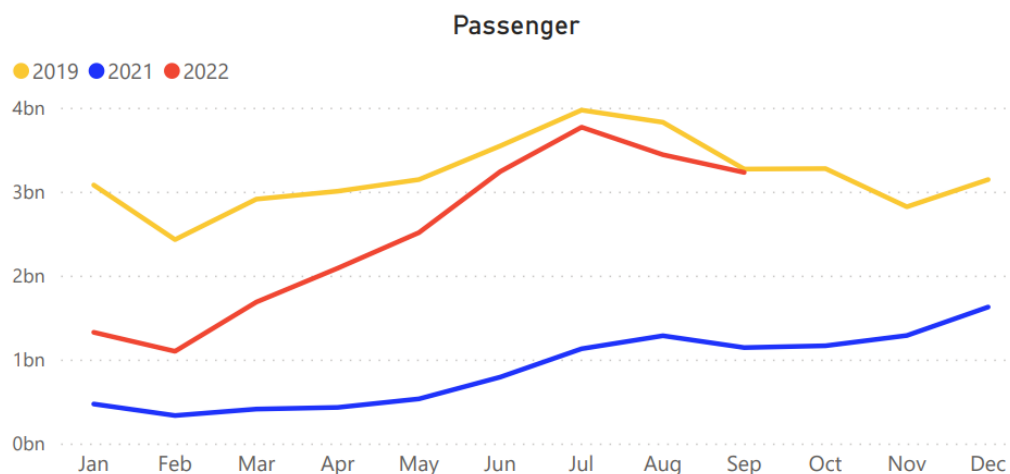
The number of overall transactions processed in September decreased by 4.82% compared to last month. Comparing to previous years, Miscellaneous (Non-Transport) transactions experience a 40.07% increase compared to September 2021 and a 3.45% difference compared to September 2019. Overall YTD SIS Transactions count are 134.79% higher compared to 2021 and 29.57% lower compared to 2019.



Number of SIS Transactions YTD (2019 vs 2021 vs 2022)

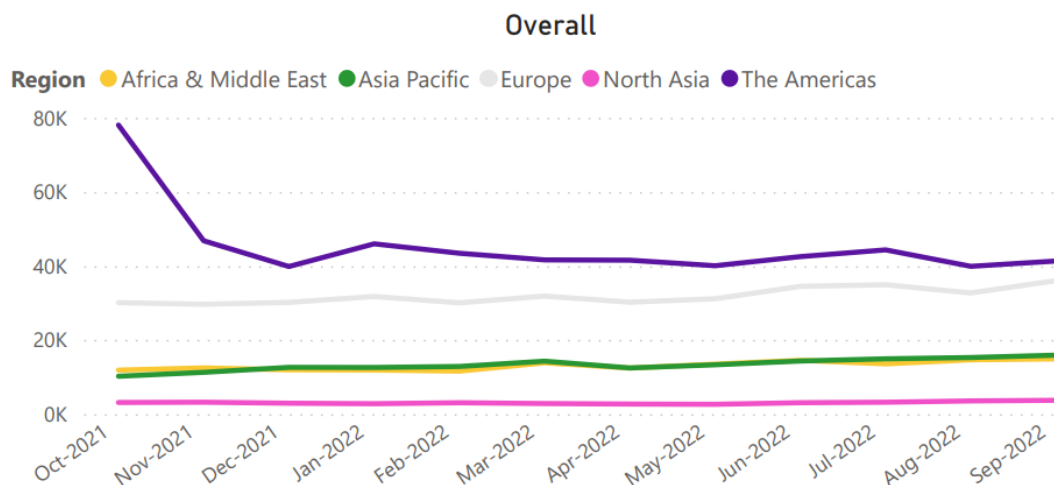
Overall Invoice Counts see a increase of 5.42% compared to August 2022. Focusing on the Passenger category, we see gains of 3.2% compared to August 2022. Comparing the Passenger category to other months, we see a 53.26% increase compared to September 2021 and a 26.56% difference compared to September 2019. Overall YTD values are 21.15% higher compared to 2021 and 27.51% lower compare to 2019

Overall USD values experiences a slowdown of 0.37% compared to last month. Looking at the passenger USD values see a 6.13% difference compared to August 2022. Comparing to previous years, Passenger Transaction values increased 182.7% compared to September 2021 and see a difference of 1.22% compared to September 2019. Overall YTD values are 144.75% higher compared to 2021 and 28.32% lower compared to 2019



USD Value (2019 vs 2021 vs 2022)

Overall invoice counts in September experience gains in all regions compared to last month, August 2022. Invoice counts are highly dependent on passenger travel, thus we expect fluctuation around the next travel season.
