

SAVE A LIFE, NOT A BAG

1. PAY ATTENTION TO CREW INSTRUCTIONS

During an emergency, cabin crew are trained to guide passengers to safety. Listening carefully and responding immediately can save valuable time.



2. LEAVE ALL BAGGAGE BEHIND

Stopping to retrieve luggage delays everyone behind you. Even a few seconds can make a critical difference during an evacuation.



3. DON'T FILM OR PHOTOGRAPH

Using phones or stopping to record events can create dangerous congestion and distract passengers from evacuating quickly.



4. KEEP AISLES AND EXITS CLEAR

Large bags and carry-ons can obstruct aisles and emergency exits, slowing down the evacuation process for everyone onboard.

5. DON'T TAKE BAGS ONTO EVACUATION SLIDES

Bringing hard or wheeled luggage onto evacuation slides can damage equipment and seriously injure passengers.



6. BE PREPARED

Keep essential small personal items, such as medication, passports, or keys, secured on your person whenever possible. Preparation helps avoid delays in an emergency.
