## Country Measures related to the 2019 NCoV outbreak

<b>Government Entry / Exit Requirements</b>	<p>Effective 23 March at 11:59pm, all airports will be closed to incoming commercial and private flights until 5 April. Aircraft facilitating departing passengers repatriating from St. Lucia will be permitted, as well as all-cargo operations.</p> <p><b>Starting March 30th and until April 30th</b>, the Hewanorra International Airport will operate from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. daily. George Charles aerodrome will operate only Mon-Fri from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.</p> <p>During the hours of operation both airports will be available for use as an alternate aerodrome or for aircraft in emergency.</p> <p>Non-citizens who have travelled to or transited mainland China, Hong Kong (SAR China), Italy, Japan, Singapore or Korea (Rep.), Spain, Mainland France, Germany, Iran and the United Kingdom in the 14 days prior to arrival will be barred entry. Any national returning to St Lucia with a travel history to any of the restricted countries will be quarantined for 14 days.</p> <p>Travellers found to have higher-than-expected temperatures will undergo additional screening.</p> <p>Persons who travel from the US within the last 14 days who develop respiratory signs and symptoms will be isolated and tested for Covid19.</p>	<b>2.4.2020</b> Government
