

# Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

Version 1 (27 September 2021)

This FAQ addresses the questions you may have relating to **in-person attendance** of the Aviation Fuel Forum in Geneva on 9-11 November 2021.

Please note that the information provided in this document is for general guidance only and might change frequently. Each traveller is responsible for verifying and monitoring the conditions that apply to their specific situation at the time of their travel.

## Travel

- **Am I allowed to enter Switzerland and where can I find the latest information?**

Currently, travellers that are allowed to enter Switzerland fall into two broad categories:

- Category 1: Travellers who are fully vaccinated (with a vaccine [approved](#) by Switzerland) or who have recovered from COVID-19 in the last six months. A valid proof of vaccination or recovery needs to be presented but a negative test result (antigen or PCR) is not required.

- Category 2: All other travellers must present a negative test result (antigen or PCR). After four to seven days in the country, this category of travellers must perform a second test, subject to a fee, and report the result to the [Swiss cantonal authorities](#).

The latest requirements and regulations for entry into Switzerland in relation to COVID-19 can be found at the website of the [Federal Office of Public Health](#). Please also refer to the [list of 'high-risk countries'](#) for which special conditions apply. It is recommended that you use the [Travel Check online tool](#) to help you verify the conditions that apply to your specific situation.

For visa requirements, please consult the website of the [Federal Department of Foreign Affairs of Switzerland](#) and contact the Embassy of Switzerland in your country.

- **Do I need to complete any form to enter Switzerland?**

All travellers (Category 1 and Category 2) entering Switzerland MUST complete a short entry form electronically at <https://swissplf.admin.ch/formular>.

Important note for all Category 2 travellers staying in Switzerland for more than 4 days: the information contained in the form shall be used by the Swiss cantonal authorities to check that the second test has been carried out after 4 to 7 days in the country.

- **Does Switzerland impose a travel ban on people travelling from the United States, Russia, etc.?**

At present, Switzerland does not impose a travel ban or quarantine requirement on any country but travellers from [high-risk countries](#) can only enter under certain conditions. We strongly recommend that you use the [Travel Check online tool](#) to verify the conditions that apply to your specific situation.

- **Which vaccines are accepted for entry to Switzerland?**

Important: For vaccinated persons, proof must be provided in the form of a Swiss COVID certificate, an EU/EFTA COVID certificate or other proof of vaccination. The vaccination proof must contain the following information: surname, first name, date of birth as well as date and place of vaccination and the vaccine used.

- **If I need to do a test before travelling back to my home country, where can I get tested?**

For travellers, the most convenient location to get a COVID-19 test is at Geneva Airport (by appointment only). The testing centre is called m3 SANITRADE located at Terminal T2 of Geneva Airport, in front of parking area P51. The centre performs both Nasopharyngeal and Saliva PCR tests, as well as Rapid Antigen Tests. It is open from 06:00 am to 07:00 pm, 7 days a week. You will need to **book an appointment**, either [online](#) or by phone (+44 22 809 07 35).

## Hotel/Venue

- **Where is the event taking place?**

The event will take place at the [Hilton Geneva Hotel and Conference Centre](#), located close to Geneva airport.

- **Is there a preferential room rate at the event hotel?**

Hilton Geneva Hotel has offered to set aside a limited number of rooms at a special rate for our delegates on a first-come-first-served basis until **Tuesday 19 October 2021**. Delegates can book directly using the following [link](#) for the dates that suit them between Sunday 7 November and Friday 12 November 2021.

The online booking tool will automatically propose a rate for the full period (i.e., 5 nights) but it is possible to select fewer nights by using the Edit Stay function at the top of the page and adjust to the dates that suit you, between 7 and 12 November. Note that under this IATA rate, your stay can only be cancelled without penalty until 31 October 2021.

For those who prefer to look at other options, there are at least two other hotels located within a short walking distance of the Hilton, which are the ibis Styles Genève Palexpo Aéroport Hotel and ibis budget Genève Palexpo Aéroport. Other hotels which are located within a short ride from Geneva airport include Mövenpick Hotel & Casino Geneva, Novotel Suites Geneve Aéroport Hotel and Crowne Plaza Geneva. The hotels will issue you a card during your stay that gives you free access to public transport.

For those who may choose to stay in the city centre, there is a good range of hotels in the city and Geneva airport is easily accessible by train from the central train station, Gare Cornavin (six-minute ride) or by a number of buses plying between the city and the airport.
