Most of the technologies incorporated by CUSS 1.x have already reached their End of Life, will be deprecated in the next years, or are no longer supported or maintained. The new CUSS 2.x environment addresses these issues and provides an opportunity for several enhancements.

What?

- **Entirely New** Version of CUSS

- **Requires** Timely Development

- **NOT** Backwards Compatible

- **1 July 2024** - Technical Specification Release
- **1 January 2025** - CUSS 2 Transition Phase starts with CUSS Version 2.3.2
- **1 January 2026** - CUSS 1 Standard no longer receives updates or fixes
