

How Competitive is Air Transport in Greece?

Aviation supports 457,000 jobs and EUR 18 billion in economic activity in Greece

Increasing that contribution depends upon a **competitive air transport industry**.

This chart shows **Greece lags behind** the European average for the competitiveness of its regulations, infrastructure, supply chain, and especially passenger facilitation.






The long term viability of the air traffic management system needs to be guaranteed through structured capital investments, including recruiting more air traffic controllers.

Passenger **charges and taxes** make flying to and from Greece more expensive. A better charges process with a stronger regulator and transparent, meaningful consultation is necessary.





Greek connectivity has improved due to more **airport capacity**. Working with stakeholders to allow further growth will benefit the country.

Recommendations

- Greece should pursue airspace modernization and reform to cut summer delays.
- A stronger regulator should ensure airport and passenger charges will protect users and consumers
- New airport infrastructure should be developed in consultation with airlines.

If these improvements are made, air transport could deliver even greater benefits to Greece by 2037.
