- IATA membership: some 340 airlines in 124 countries.
- IATA members represent over 80% of total scheduled traffic
- IATA members' total freight (scheduled) 53 million tonnes in 2023, of which 36 million tonnes were international
- IATA members' total cargo tonne-kilometers (scheduled) 225 billion tonne-kilometers in 2023, of which 196 billion tonne-kilometers were international
- IATA members' total passengers 2023 (scheduled) 3.0 billion, of which 1.2 billion were international
- IATA members' total revenue passenger-kilometers 2023 (scheduled) 6.5 trillion passenger-kilometers, of which 4.1 trillion passenger-kilometers were international

IATA Annual General Meeting & World Air Transport Summit

- Formalizes industry positions on aviation and public policy issues and provides a focus on emerging issues
- Attended by representatives from IATA member airlines, industry partners, international and regional associations, manufacturers, suppliers, and governments
- The first Annual General (AGM) was held in Montreal, Canada in October 1945
- The 80th AGM took take place in Dubai, UAE on 2-4 June 2024, hosted by Emirates
- The 81st AGM will take place in Delhi, India on 1-3 June 2025, hosted by IndiGo

IATA Financial Services

- In 2023, IATA Financial Settlement Systems (IFSS) processed some \$445.3 billion excluding refunds as follows:
 - o Billing and Settlement Plan (BSP) \$225.0 billion (including \$18.2 billion in refunds)
 - o Cargo Account Settlement Systems (CASS) \$42.7 billion
 - o IATA Clearing House (ICH) \$58.95 billion
 - o IATA Currency Clearance Service (ICCS) \$38.5 billion
 - Simplified Invoicing and Settlement (SIS) \$76.4 billion
 - Enhancement & Financing \$3.7 billion
